

Aluminum Cans	Rinsed beverage cans.	Aluminum foil, pie pans, food cans, aerosol cans, pet food cans
Batteries - Household	Lithium, alkaline, carbon zinc, mercury, silver oxide, rechargable, etc	
Batteries - Vehicle	Vehicle, ATV, snowmachine batteries	*Some facilities do not accept cracked/leaking batteries*
<b>Cardboard</b>	Paper towel rolls, egg cartons, pizza box tops, corrugated cardboard	Waxy cardboard, food residue (i.e. pizza box bottoms)
Compact Fluorescent Bulbs	Intact fluorescent compact bulbs	Broken bulbs
Electronics	TVs, monitors, computers, laptops, servers, tablets, smartphones, desktop peripherals, ink toner/cartridges, printers, copiers, cords/cables, small household appliances	CD/DVD/Floppy disks, exit signs, smoke and/or carbon monoxide alarms, thermostats (containing mercury), vacuums, VHS/cassette tapes, and anything containing compressed refrigerant
Fluorescent Tube Lights	Intact fluorescent tubes	Broken tubes
Plastic Grocery Bags	Plastic grocery bags	
Paper	Mixed paper (cereal boxes, glossy paper, books, magazines, phone books, paper gift wrap), newspaper, and office paper	Paper cups/plates, napkins, tissues, milk cartons, juice boxes, hardcover books (unless binding is removed), binder clips
Plastic #1 PET & #2 HDPE	Rinsed #1 bottles with mouths smaller than the container; Rinsed #2 jugs with necks and screw tops including: milk, detergent jugs, etc.	Bottle caps, other numbered plastics, items with food residue, produce and take-out containers, cups, tubs, oil/chemical containers, plastic bags
Steel Cans	Rinsed food cans	Food residue, labels
